Information for Applicants

Application Deadline

The early application deadline for the Bachelor of Journalism program is February 15. The regular admission deadline is June 1. The international student deadline is December 31.

Space Available

The Bachelor of Journalism is a limited enrolment program. Approximately 45 spaces are available each year. We encourage submitting an early application.

Notification of Decisions

Applications will be evaluated on a rolling basis beginning on October 15 until the June I deadline. Please apply as early as possible.

Wait List

The School of Journalism maintains a ranked wait list for places in the Bachelor of Journalism program. Applicants placed on the wait list will be so informed; they will also be informed of their position on the wait list, and regularly updated as spaces become available in the program.

Applicants with Special Needs

If you consider yourself an applicant with special needs, please contact the Registrar's Office to be advised of services available at the University of King's College and Dalhousie University. This information will be used only to assess whether the universities are able to provide the necessary supports. It will not be considered as part of the admissions process.

Personal Information and Protection of Privacy

The information requested on this form is collected under the authority of the King's College Act (c.44, S.N.S. 1998) and is needed to assign your university identification number; to process your application for admission; to verify your qualifications and determine your eligibility for admission; for administration of student records, scholarships, and awards; for provision of student and alumni services; and for university planning and research. Upon registration at King's, this information will form part of your student record and will be used to document your progress in an academic program. Students' personal information may be disclosed, as required, to academic and administrative units; to donors or representatives of university-administered scholarships/bursaries/awards; to federal and provincial agencies as legally required; and to student governance associations.  - Applicants must ensure that official transcripts are forwarded directly to the Registrar's Office from any university or college previously attended.
 - Applicants are responsible to send in final transcripts indicating that a Bachelor's degree has been awarded before the program's start date.
 - It is not necessary for current students or graduates of either King's or Dalhousie University to submit a transcript of their marks from King's or Dalhousie.
- Autobiographical sketch
 - The one-thousand word autobiographical sketch will help the Journalism Admissions Committee judge your writing ability and decide how well-suited you are to the Bachelor of Journalism program.
 - The sketch should be something more than a simple compilation of dates, places and subjects. It should tell us why you are interested in the journalism program; we want to know something about your academic strengths (and weaknesses), your general interests, the work you may have done in journalism and other fields, and anything else that would contribute to a well-rounded story about yourself.
- Portfolio (optional)
 - Please submit selected clippings or recordings of your best work in journalism. Submit all text in hard copy and any audio/visual work by cd or dvd.
 - Please ensure your name is clearly attached to each submission.
 - Please don't spend time or money on an elaborate presentation; the committee is only interested in content.
