

Harrison McCain Foundation Scholarship application form

The Harrison McCain Scholarship/Bursaries are available annually to entering students attending university who have graduated from a high school in Canada. Each award has a program value of \$16,000 payable over a four-year course of study in the amount of \$4,000 per year. Criteria for the awards include a minimum 80% average in senior year of high school, financial need, leadership qualities and a recognized initiative in funding their own education. The number of scholarship/bursaries available may vary from year to year. Renewal criteria to be met each year.

The strongest papers will examine the claim from more than one angle, show evidence of creative thinking, and express ideas in clear, structured, and interesting ways.
