## George Cooper - Remarks at UKC Athletics' Awards - March 28, 2015

You will recall from FYP that in those days people who refused to take part in society were known as "the idiotes" – the ancient Greek word from which we get our modern word idiot. And if you didn't participate in the civic life of Percilean Athens you were stoned.
