

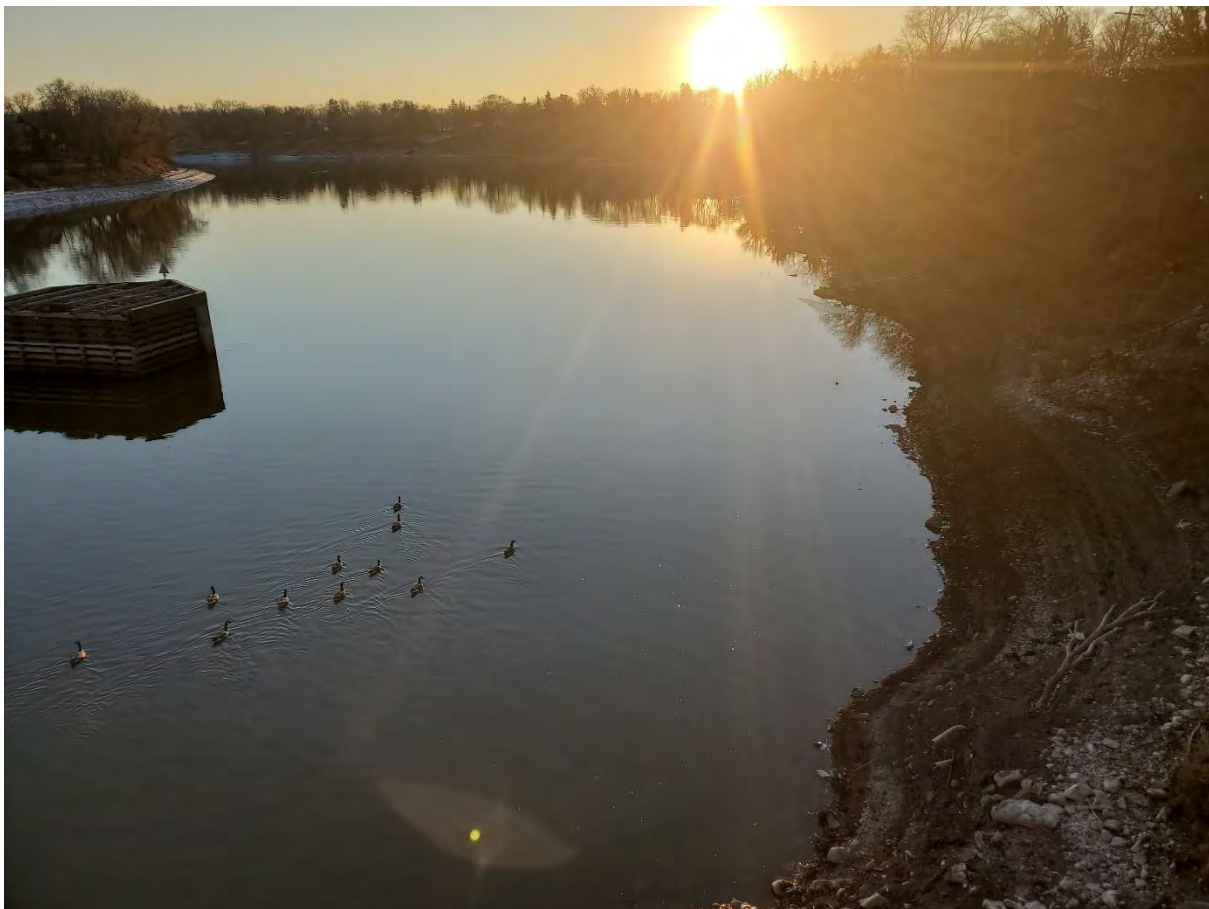
Best Photo from Every Entry

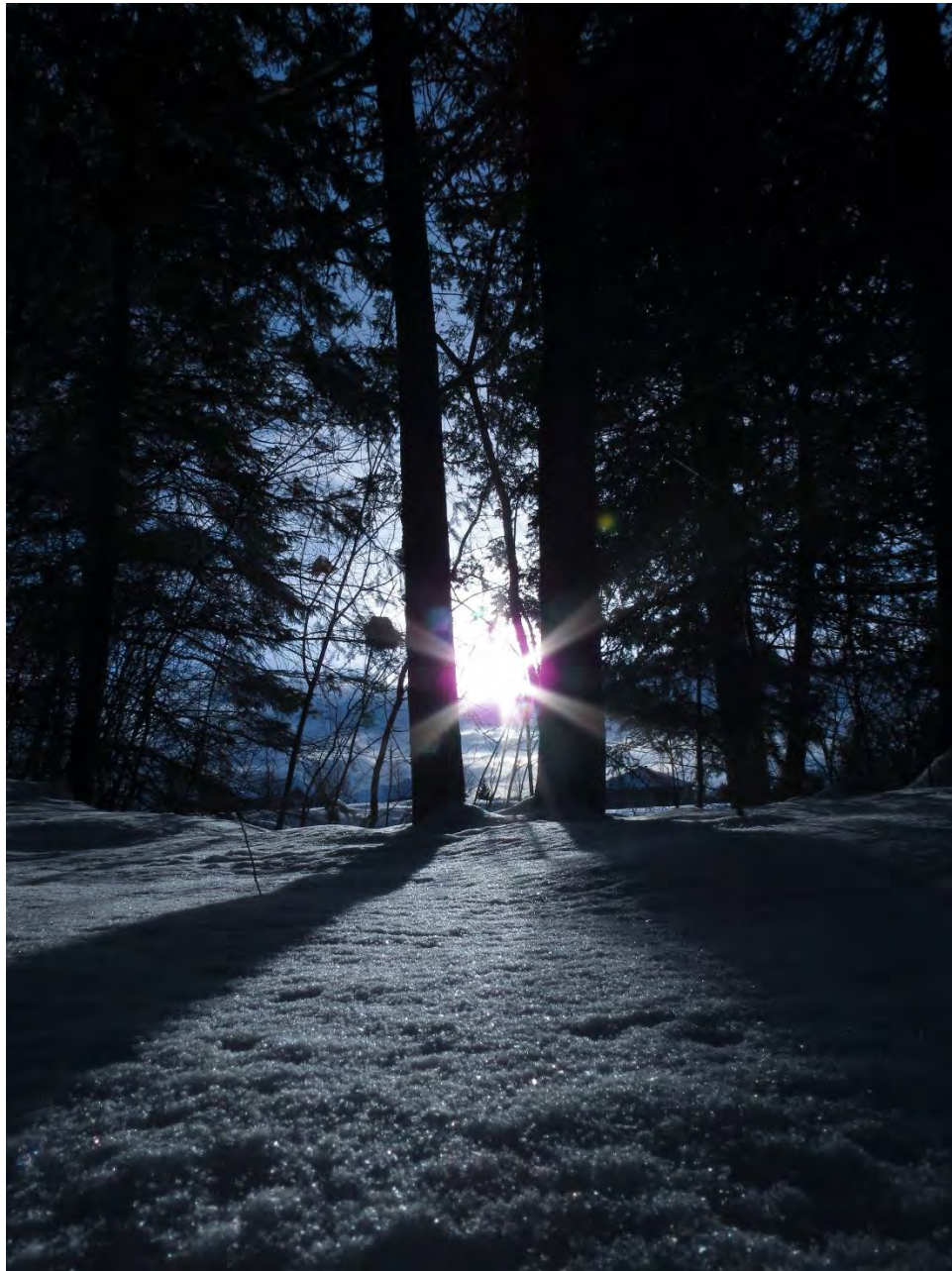

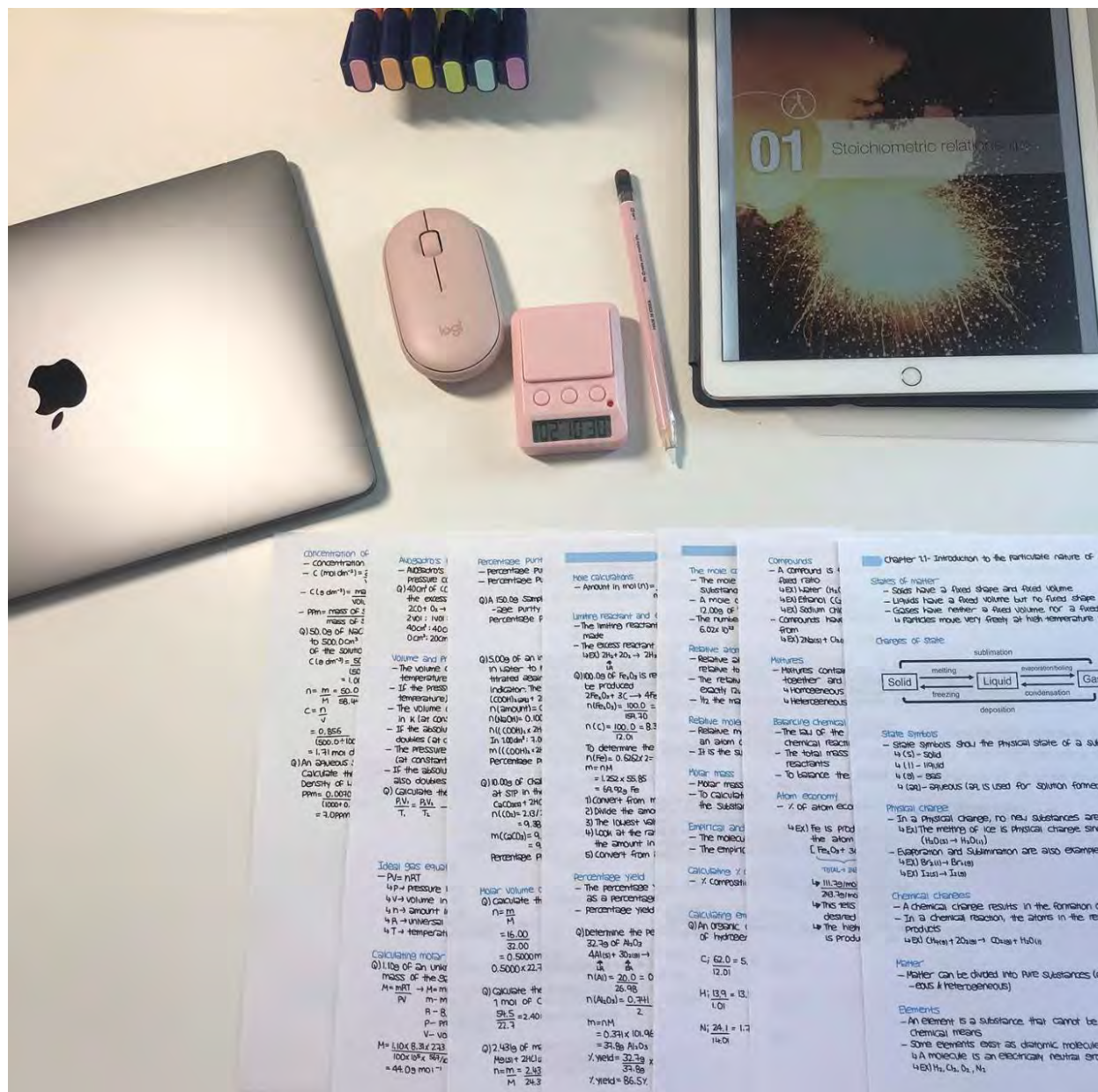
