WHY DO THE HUMANITIES MATTER TODAY?

The humanities ask—and answer—the big questions about our lives. Studying the humanities will help you develop the critical thinking and communication skills that are crucial to meaningful employment, active citizenship and healthy relationships.

Students who pursue studies in the humanities develop a broad and flexible skill set, which allows them to confront an unpredictable future with creativity, ingenuity and resilience.

The humanities encourage us to examine works of art, literature, philosophy and political science (among others) to assist us as we try to understand and improve our world and ourselves.

WHAT IS HYP?

The HYP program is an opportunity to experience a slice of life in King's Foundation Year Program (FYP), Canada's pre-eminent great books program.

FYP students spend their first year of university on a chronological odyssey through the ages, from ancient civilizations to the modern era, reading the works that have shaped our world. Students grapple directly with primary texts from ancient epics and religious texts to the most seminal works of philosophy, literature and politics, as well as tracing developments in art, music, architecture and science. Students build a comprehensive cultural map by becoming acquainted with the traditions of thought that have helped set our present horizons.

For nine days in the summer, high school students are invited to experience what it would be like to be part of such a program, immersed in a world of big ideas, with peers from across Canada who are passionate about the same things. Each year, the HYP program will pick up on a thread in the FYP curriculum such as love, truth, beauty, power or justice, and will include a workshop from King's journalism.

HYP students live in residence, eat together in Prince Hall, attend morning lectures by a cast of experts on the subject matter and participate in small group discussions (called "tutorials") to deepen understanding. In the afternoons and evenings, HYP students take part in co-curricular workshops and activities and visit local sites. For students coming from outside the region, it's a chance to see what their life in Halifax could be like and build confidence about going away to university. The group is led by an academic and a team of upper year King's students.

PROGRAM FEES AND ENROLMENT

The \$1,650 program fee includes accommodation, all meals, academic activities and materials, field trips and evening events.

HYP enrols just 40 students, all of whom live on campus in residence. This helps us build a highly engaged learning community.

Students local to the Halifax Regional Municipality are automatically considered for an entrance bursary after submitting their program application.

Students from outside HRM can request bursary support after applying—details will be provided.

Good news! Any student that takes HYP and then enrols at King's after high school will automatically earn a \$1,500 entrance award.
